This proposition would authorize the District to: renovate Oakville School (including relocating kitchen; installing metal roofing; upgrading bathrooms, locker rooms and alarm, PA and HVAC systems; constructing a new building to replace the existing elementary building; and renovating high school entry); issue no more than \$5,600,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 21 years; and levy annual excess property taxes to repay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 2019-20.4.
