VOTING INSTRUCTIONS

2020 General Election

Each candidate for President and Vice President is the official nominee of a political party. For other partisan offices, each candidate may state a political party that he or she prefers. A candidate's preference does not imply that the candidate is nominated or endorsed by the party, or that the party approves of or associates with the candidate.

Online Voters' Guide

- An Online Voters' Guide is available online at Elections.lewiscountywa.gov

Sign your return envelope

- Read and sign the voter declaration, date it, and return. Be sure you are signing your own declaration envelope.
- Your signed declaration envelope **must be returned** for your ballot to count.
- A Power of Attorney cannot be used to sign a ballot for someone else. A Signature Stamp is not acceptable.
- If you can't sign, make a mark and have two witnesses sign.

Return your ballot

- You can vote and return your ballot as soon as you receive it. Returning your ballot early allows time to correct any issues with your signature so we can count your ballot.
- You can return your ballot by:
 - **Mail.** We recommend mailing your ballot by the Friday before Election Day to make sure it gets post marked in time. Your ballot must be post marked by Election Day. No Postage Necessary.
 - **Ballot drop boxes.** Deposit your ballot in a ballot drop box. Visit Elections.lewiscountywa.gov for a list of drop box locations. Ballot drop boxes close at 8 P.M. Election Day.

Voting centers

- Accessible equipment is available in the Lewis County Election Department during normal business hours 18 days prior to every election. We are open Monday through Friday 8 A.M. - 4:30 P.M. and 8 A.M. - 8 P.M. on Election Day.

Replacement ballots

- If you did not receive a ballot, or need a replacement, call 360-740-1164 or visit the Lewis County Election Department. Replacement ballots can also be printed online at VoteWA.gov - select My Ballot > Online Ballot.

Confirm your ballot's receipt

- Visit VoteWA.gov - select My Ballot > Ballot Status to see if your ballot has been received.
