RESOLUTION NO. 24-001

AUTHORIZING PROPERTY TAX LEVY

A **RESOLUTION** of the Board of Fire Commissioners (the "Board") of Lewis County Fire Protection District No. 17 (the "District") providing for the submission to the voters of the District at a special election to be held therein on April 23, 2024, in conjunction with the State special election to be held on the same day, a proposition authorizing a regular property tax levy of One Dollar (\$1.00) per One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) in assessed valuation.

WHEREAS, the Board of the District recognizes that its provision of fire and emergency medical services is essential and necessary for the protection of the health and life of the residents of the District, which requires expenditure of revenues for maintenance, operations, equipment, and structures;

WHEREAS, the District currently receives service by contract from Pierce County Fire District No. 23 ("PCFD 23"), which is not a long-term solution, and which does not ensure continuity of service for the constituents of the District;

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that a merger into PCFD 23 should be pursued in order to permanently guarantee uninterrupted fire and EMS;

WHEREAS, in order to set the stage for a potential merger to be voted upon by registered voters within the District, it is critical to align the tax rates of the District more closely with those of PCFD 23 which this measure will accomplish;

WHEREAS, the current levy rate for the District is approximately ____ Cents (\$0.5 ?) per One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) assessed value; and

WHEREAS, the District's levy increases are limited by state law to an increase of one hundred one percent (101%) per year unless the voters of the District approve a greater increase.

NOW. THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, as follows:

SECTION 1. The District shall provide for fire and emergency medical services, including related personnel costs, training for such personnel, and related equipment, supplies, vehicles, and structures needed for the provision of fire and emergency medical services, as authorized by law.

SECTION 2. In order to provide the revenue adequate to pay the costs of maintaining and providing the services described in Section 1, and to assure the continuation and improvement of such services, the District shall, in accordance with RCW 84.55.050, remove the limitation on regular property taxes imposed by RCW 84.55.010, levy beginning in 2024, and collect beginning in 2025, pursuant to RCW 52.16.130 and RCW 52.16.140, general tax on taxable property within the District at a rate of One Dollar (\$1.00) per One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) of assessed valuation. The resulting levy dollar amount would thereafter be used for the purpose of computing the limitations for subsequent levies under RCW 84.55.050.

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SECTION 3. There shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the District for their ratification or rejection at an election on April 23, 2024, the question of whether or not such levy shall be made.

SECTION 4. The District's attorney is authorized to make such minor adjustments to the wording of such proposition as deemed appropriate or as may be recommended by the Lewis County Prosecuting Attorney's Office or the Lewis County Auditor, as long as the intent of the proposition remains clear and as approved by the Board.

SECTION 5. Pursuant to RCW 84.55.050 and 29A.36.071, the Lewis County Prosecuting Attorney is requested to prepare the concise description of the aforesaid proposition for the ballot title in substantially the following form:

PROPOSITION NO. 1 LEWIS COUNTY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT NO. 17 AUTHORIZING REGULAR PROPERTY TAX LEVY

The Board of Fire Commissioners of Lewis County Fire Protection District No. 17 (the "District"), adopted Resolution No. [24/2021] concerning the District's regular property tax levy. This measure would authorize a regular property tax levy of One Dollar (\$1.00) per One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) of assessed valuation in 2024 (for collection in 2025), and the resulting levy dollar amount would thereafter be used for the purpose of computing the limitations for subsequent levies under RCW 84.55.050. SECTION 6. The Secretary of the District is directed to (a) certify to the Auditor a copy of this Resolution showing its adoption by the Board by February 23, 2024; and (b) perform such other duties as are necessary and required by law in submitting to the voters of the District at the aforesaid election the proposition of whether such tax levy shall be made.

SECTION 7. The Fire Chief of the District is authorized to implement such administrative procedures as may be necessary to carry out the directives of this Resolution.

SECTION 8. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect upon passage and signatures hereon.

SECTION 9. If any provision of this Resolution is declared by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or illegal, then such provision shall be null and void and shall be severable from the remaining provisions of this Resolution, and shall in no way affect the validity of the other provisions of this Resolution.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT - PROPOSITION NO. 1

Lewis County Fire Protection District No. 17 (the "District") seeks voter approval to increase its regular property tax levy to One Dollar (\$1.00) per One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) of assessed valuation in 2024 (with collection beginning in 2025), which is an increase of approximately \$0.4/l per One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) of assessed valuation. This levy is the District's primary funding source. The District intends to commence the steps later this year to merge into the Pierce County Fire District No. 23 ("PCFD 23") which currently provides service to the District by contract. Voter approval of this measure will closely align the District's levy rate with that of PCFD 23 such that the merger, if approved, would result in minimal tax adjustments for the property owners in either district.
