- A A RESOLUTION of the Board of Directors of Centralia School District No. 401, Lewis and Thurston Counties, Washington, providing for the submission to the qualified electors of the District at a special election to be held therein on February 10, 2026, of the proposition of whether excess taxes should be levied of \$7,150,000 in 2026 for collection in 2027, \$7,640,000 in 2027 for collection in 2028, and \$8,157,000 in 2028 for collection in 2029, said excess taxes to pay part of the cost of educational programs and operations support of the District.

RESOLUTION NO. 2025-20

- A A RESOLUTION of the Board of Directors of Centralia School District No. 401, Lewis and Thurston Counties, Washington, providing for the submission to the qualified electors of the District at a special election to be held therein on February 10, 2026, of the proposition of whether excess taxes should be levied of \$7,150,000 in 2026 for collection in 2027, \$7,640,000 in 2027 for collection in 2028, and \$8,157,000 in 2028 for collection in 2029, said excess taxes to pay part of the cost of educational programs and operations support of the District.

WHEREAS, Centralia School District No. 401, Lewis and Thurston Counties, Washington (the "District"), in prior years had in effect an educational programs operations levy in order to enable the District to pay for its educational programs and services, including teaching, school supplies, athletics, buildings and transportation; and

WHEREAS, the prior educational programs and operations levies have now expired; and

WHEREAS, the money in and to be paid into the General Fund of the District during the 2026-27, 2027-2028 and 2028-2029 school years will be insufficient to enable the District to pay for eligible educational programs and operations and to properly meet the educational needs of the students attending District schools; and

WHEREAS, in the event the State Legislature increases education funding to the District, the District would, therefore, review annually and determine the need to roll back the levies; and

WHEREAS, in order to properly provide for such educational programs and operations and such educational needs, the Board of Directors of the District deems it necessary to levy the following taxes upon all of the taxable property within the District in excess of the maximum annual tax levy permitted by law to be levied within the District without a vote of the electors:

- A. A tax of approximately \$1.70 per thousand dollars of assessed valuation to provide \$7,150,000, said levy to be made in 2026 for collection in 2027; and
- B. A tax of approximately \$1.75 per thousand dollars of assessed valuation to provide \$7,640,000, said levy to be made in 2027 for collection in 2028; and

C. A tax of approximately \$1.80 per thousand dollars of assessed valuation to provide \$8,157,000, said levy to be made in 2028 for collection in 2029.

WHEREAS, the Constitution and laws of the State of Washington require that the question of whether or not such excess taxes may be levied must be submitted to the qualified electors of the District for their ratification or rejection;

WHEREAS, the District has received approval of its levy spending plan from the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction under RCW 28A.505.240 as required by RCW 84.52.053(4), a copy of which is on file with the District;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF CENTRALIA SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 401, LEWIS AND THURSTON COUNTIES, WASHINGTON, as follows:

Section 1. The following taxes for the District's General Fund should be levied upon all of the taxable property within the District in excess of the maximum annual tax levy permitted by law to be levied within the District without a vote of the electors:

- A. \$7,150,000, said levy to be made in 2026 for collection in 2027; and
- B. \$7,640,000, said levy to be made in 2027 for collection in 2028; and
- C. \$8,157,000, said levy to be made in 2028 for collection in 2029.

The estimated levy rate depends upon the final dollar amount of assessed value of the property within the District. At this time, based upon information provided by the Lewis County Assessor's office, the levy rate for the 2027 levy is \$1.70 per thousand dollars of assessed valuation, and the levy rate for the 2028 levy is \$1.75 per thousand dollars of assessed valuation and the levy rate for the 2029 levy is \$1.80 per thousand dollars of assessed valuation. The exact levy rate shall be adjusted based upon the legal limits and the actual assessed value of the property within the District at the time of the levy. Upon approval by the voters of the proposition substantially in the form set forth below, the District may use the proceeds of said levies during the 2026-27, 2027-28 and 2028-29 school years

by incurring an indebtedness by the issuance of short term obligations against the General Fund of the District as authorized by Chapter 39.50 RCW, and by contracting indebtedness pursuant to RCW 28A.530.080, and may expend the proceeds of said levies to pay such part of the general expenses of educational programs and operations of the District during such school years as may be authorized or allowed by law for the use of excess levy funds.

Section 2. It is hereby found and declared that the best interests of the District require the submission to the qualified electors of the District of the proposition of whether or not the District shall levy such excess tax for their ratification or rejection at a special election to be held therein on February 10, 2026.

The Lewis County Auditor, as *ex officio* supervisor of elections in Lewis County, Washington, is hereby requested to call and conduct said special election to be held within the District on said date and to submit to the qualified electors of the District the proposition substantially in the form hereinafter set forth. The Secretary of the Board of Directors is hereby authorized and directed to certify said proposition substantially in the following form:



The Executive Director is authorized to approve changes to the ballot title, if any, deemed necessary by the Lewis County Auditor or the Lewis County Prosecuting Attorney.

Section 4. Pursuant to authority granted by RCW 29A.32.220, the Board of Directors hereby authorizes the District's participation in the local voters' pamphlet for the February 10, 2026 election and requests that the Lewis County Auditor prepare and publish a voters' pamphlet for this proposition. The District understands and agrees that it will be required to pay its proportionate share of the expenses of the voters' pamphlet.



Passage of Proposition No. 1 would allow the levy of \$7,150,000, \$7,640,000, and \$8,157,000 in property taxes within Centralia School District No. 401 for collection in 2027, 2028, and 2029, respectively. The current Educational Programs and Operations (EP&O) levy expires at the end of 2026. This replacement levy would continue funding for all taxable property within the District to support educational programs and operations not fully funded by the State. In accordance with Resolution No. 2025-20 approving this proposition, these taxes would be collected over three years and deposited in the District's General Fund to pay part of the costs of the District's instructional programs, student supports, safety initiatives, school supplies, activities, athletics, educational technology, and other operations essential to students. The exact levy rates will be adjusted based on the actual assessed valuation of property within the District at the time of levy. If State funding formulas or revenues change in a way that increases funding to the District, the District will review the levy amounts and may adjust collections accordingly.
